So, if you go there at different times you can see either water flowing in those riverbeds, or isolated pools of water, or even dry waterbeds. Thanks to the forester of the Züriberg, CrowdWater has the possibility to publicly show where interesting temporary streams can be found. Boards help to find the right places and raise attention to the CrowdWater project. Enjoy the colourful autumn forest and help us to collect valuable data about temporary streams right in the city of Zurich.

An expedition through the Irchelpark!

This summer, visitors of the Irchel park were able to take part in a competition organized by the Science Lab UZH. The task was to use the "iNaturalist App" to document the biodiversity in the Irchel Park. The diversity of fauna and flora documented was impressive. A total of 961 observations and 344 different species were observed. The winners have now received their prizes.

Winners of the Irchel Biodiversity competition:

1st place: Gergely Gajda (552 observations and 164 species)

2nd place: Catrina Gian-Andrea (87 observations and 74 species)

3rd place: Romain Dupraz - receives third place for the determination and confirmation in the app of 140 observed species.

We would like to thank all observers for their participation in the competition and hope that you will continue to collect data for the "Irchel Biodiversity" project with the «iNaturalist app». Each season showcases a different biodiversity! Come and discover it!
