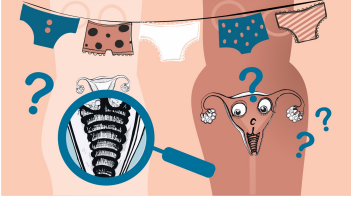
The introductory workshop "Citizen Science Projects with Impact" enters a new round (only German)

The Marie project: it's time to talk about vaginal health!

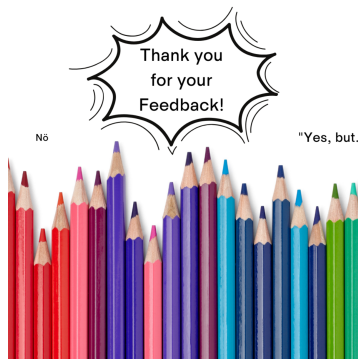

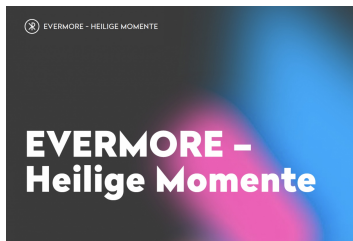

The 10 Swiss Citizen Science Principles are now available in four languages!

The principles are intended to serve as a common basis and orientation for all Citizen Science stakeholders. They were developed in a participatory process and feedback from an open online consultation was also incorporated. An initial discussion of the principles and reflection on their use in practice took place at the *Schweiz forscht* [network meeting](#) on March 8, 2022.

EVERMORE-App: exploring spirituality in everyday life together

The researchers of Project 6 of the URPP "Digital Religion(s)" investigate together with app users how the use of the meditation and prayer app EVERMORE affects their everyday life, their spirituality, their self-perception and their relationships. The goal of the reserach project is to gain deeper insights into the dynamics of lived spirituality in a culture of digitality.

New texts for the Technorama

What would science communication look like if it were designed by the people to whom it is actually addressed? The project "Science Communication by Laypersons for Laypersons" explores this little known question. In a large workshop held with visitors of the Technorama on March 5, Citizen Scientists, the Science Center, and text linguists discussed and tested how to redesign the exhibit's texts in Technorama. The outcome includes an additional training course for Technorama staff, and a visitors interest group which Technorama can consult in the future.

The second workshop with URPP's Citizen Science Advisory Panel, "Human Reproduction reloaded," was held on March 18, 2022. Dr. Daniel Drewniak presented preliminary findings from the IDENTITY study, in which he is researching the experiences of individuals conceived with the help of sperm donation. Anina Meier presented her ethnological research on "Potentialities of CRISPR in Human Reproduction." This was followed by a discussion of the questionnaire for the planned survey on attitudes towards assisted reproductive medicine. The workshop ended with a joint lunch.
