New 2020 Program Senior University UZH3: Co-created Citizen Science Increasingly Important

The senior university of UZH and ETHZ with their 3000 members 60+ starts into the new semester on February 25, 2020. In its 35th year, the new program offers 50 lectures from UZH and ETHZ experts as well as special events such as a full-year writing course and athletic activities organized by ASVZ (www.seniorenuni.uzh.ch). Registrations for a one-year membership are possible any time. More than 35 members engage in co-creative Citizen Science within a «Participatory UZH3 Working Group» engaging in projects in the domains of research or the development of new educational tools. In fact, UZH3 supports recruitment of 60+-year-olds for co-created research projects. The Working Group is open to all members and is professionally supported by the Participatory Science Academy at the Zurich Citizen Science Center.



Documenting Biodiversity in Irchel Park

Zürich's Irchel Park hosts not only the University of Zurich Irchel Campus but also high biodiversity. The Campus and the surrounding park were built in the 1970s with the goal of creating a space in which both students and nature can thrive and is now an oasis of diversity of organisms and habitats. The [Irchel Nature Trail](#) was opened in 2019 to raise awareness about this diversity and ecological interactions.

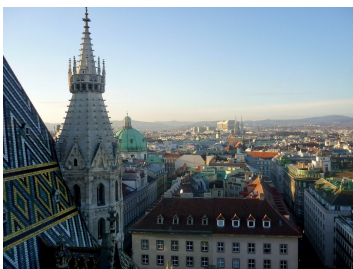
Workshops for Doctoral Students and Postdocs

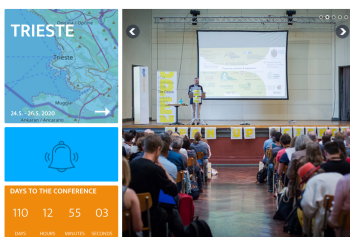
