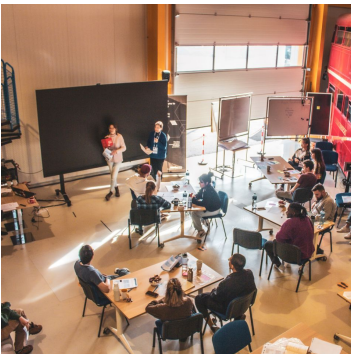

HealthFerm co-design workshop to kick off citizen science activities

Within the HealthFerm project, CC-CS establishes a network of food scientists and citizen scientists with the aim to document fermented food biodiversity in Europe. On 16 March, together with food scientists from ETH we met a diverse group of enthusiasts – from chemists to hobbyists who have been passionate about sourdough since the Covid19 shutdown – and discussed intriguing factors that influence our starters. Next step will be to incorporate these concerns into the research and generate a multifaceted representation of the microbial diversity of Swiss sourdough.

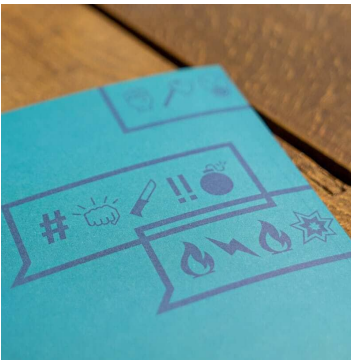

Stop Hate Speech: Help optimize machine learning algorithms to detect toxic comments

The Stop Hate Speech project team has developed an automatic classification system for hate speech and toxic language. We now need your help to optimize the algorithm and detect hate speech more easily.

The project aims to automatically detect toxic and hateful comments in comment sections of online newspaper platforms and in social media and to test different strategies to counter them. The more comments are classified, the better it will work!

The workshops included an introduction to the CrowdWater app and presentations of the tools and monitoring strategies used by the other projects. The workshops are part of Sara's PhD project on the potential value of different citizen science approaches for water quality observations.
