### Citizen Science community meets in Aarhus, Denmark

After more than 2 years, the Citizen Science community (mainly from Europe) met again in-person! The occasion was the “Engaging Citizen Science” conference on 25-26 April in Aarhus (more on this when the proceedings will be out). This was also the occasion to meet for the first time the TIME4CS team, after almost 16 months of working together remotely. TIME4CS is a EU project that aims at supporting and facilitating the implementation of sustainable institutional changes in research performing organizations to promote Citizen Science. **To learn more about the project, watch the recently published short video.**

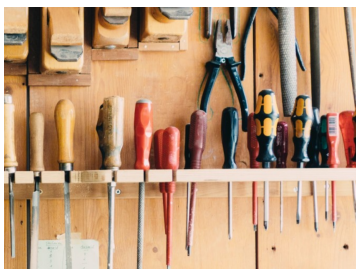


### EU Project INCENTIVE: 2-day workshop in Barcelona

## NEWS FROM THE PARTICIPATORY SCIENCE ACADEMY

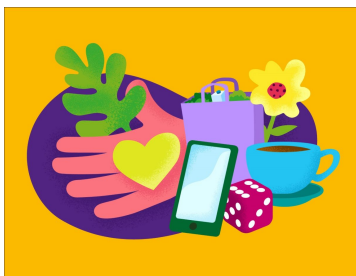


### Citizen Science resources at a glance

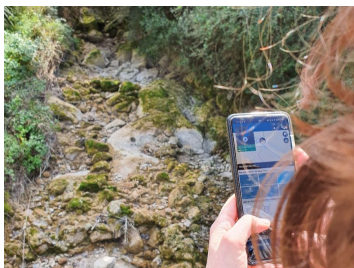

She also interviews adult "donor children" and shows alternative forms of parenthood, thus taking up central themes of the URPP.
