Barrier-free mobility in the city of Zurich

The University of Zurich is launching the project "ZuriACT: Zurich Accessible CiTy" in cooperation with the city of Zurich. ZuriACT aims to create the basis for enriching sidewalk barriers data for mobility-restricted/impaired persons in Zurich. To do this, the project is looking for adults with agerelated and situational mobility restrictions (e.g., parents with a pushchair), and mobility disabilities who would like to share their know-how and contribute to collecting data via a web application with the team's support.

The little plane tree trail: discovering urban trees with your smartphone

In the industrial district, Zurich's heat hotspot, three selected habitats of plane trees were analyzed and their climate impact was calculated. The web app «Züri begrünt» accompanies the visit to the three locations, contains an audio guide in Swiss German and a lot of interesting information about the climate-ecological effect of the trees. The tree tour was created as part of a seed grant from the Participatory Science Academy and was realized by the Zurich indie web lab su-pa.net. The information boards with quiz questions and QR codes will be placed near the plane trees from July. Have fun discovering!




Results of Citizen Science project "My Survival Story" published in scientific article

The results of the study by My Survival Story and the Institute for Complementary and Integrative Medicine of the University Hospital Zurich, funded by the Participatory Science Academy and the Swiss Cancer Foundation, are now published in an open-access scientific article.

The use of a co-creative citizen science approach helped identify relevant features of cancer survival stories and following a needs-oriented approach. Thus, the stories could be a helpful resource for patient education regarding coping with the disease.
