The team of the Citizen Science Center Zurich wishes you a belated Happy 2019!

2018 was an exciting year for the Center, with most of the activities focused on building it up from the ground. The team was hired between April and September, and an initial version of our crowdsourcing platform was released in mid-September, hosting a pilot Citizen Science project on linguistics. In the meanwhile, we interacted with more than 30 research groups both at UZH and ETH and discussed potential applications of the methodology to help scientists produce excellent participatory science. We extended the official Center's membership and reached out to local and Swiss citizens organization to plant the seeds for our Citizen Scientists community.

INTERNAL NEWS

Second meeting of the General Assembly

The second meeting of the Center's General Assembly happened on 29 November 2018. The General Assembly is the central cog of the Center, and its responsibilities include approval of strategy, budget, membership, and more. It is composed of the Center's full members (including professors and researchers at UZH or ETH) and meets once a year to deliberate on current issues.

This year's deliberations included, among other, approval of the 2019 financial budget, elections of new members of the <u>Board of Directors</u>, and acceptance of the applications for new full members. Our current members represent a community of more than 300 researchers at UZH and ETHZ.

At the governance level, the exciting news concerns the composition of the Board of Directors, which has been increased from two to three representatives for each of the two founding institutions. The current composition includes:
