It is part of the Collaborative Research on Science and Society (CROSS) Program.

## 90% of cancer patients had positive emotions after watching My Survival Stories

My Survival Story collects personal narratives from cancer survivors and shares them online as videos and podcasts. My Survival Story and the Institute for Complementary and Integrative Medicine, USZ, partnered to investigate in a scientific study how cancer patients and their relatives perceive such narratives. #### **Risk factors with MS**

The topic «Risk Factors and MS» was repeatedly suggested by participants of the Swiss MS Registry as a desired topic to learn more about the causes of MS. The collaboration has resulted in the new "Risk Factors and MS" survey, which will be launched in April 2021. The first part of the survey will capture the assessments of the participants themselves, the second part consists of a set of known risk factors, which will be compared between persons with and without MS. ### Research Publication: Crowdsourcing snake identification with online communitites

Species identification can be challenging for biologists, healthcare practitioners and members of the general public. Snakes are no exception, and the potential medical consequences of venomous snake misidentification can be significant. The Snake ID Challenge aimed at assessing the capacity of online communities to correctly identify snakes from photographs. Therefore a week-long citizen science challenge was hosted in 2019 on our platform. The researchers recently published their findings in the Royal Society Journal.

How healthy are Swiss soils? Where are they the healthiest and why is that?
