Participatory Science Academy

We are thrilled to report that Mike Martin and Kevin Schawinski have successfully applied for funds with the Mercator Foundation Switzerland to establish the Participatory Science Academy ("Partizipative Wissenschaftsakademie", PWA). The foundation has granted 2.58 million CHF over a period of four years. The Academy seeks to empower citizens and scientists to collaborate in all phases of the research process. To reach that goal, the Academy provides training and knowledge for citizen science for both citizen scientists as well as academic scientists.

Seed funding

In order to enable the joint development of promising ideas, the PWA awards seed grants to project teams. Up to 50'000 CHF for up to five project teams can be awarded every year. Non-traditional Data Approaches and SDGs Workshop

Vienna, 3-5 October 2018, Laxenburg

An international group of Citizen Science experts from the US, Europe, Asia and Africa assembled at the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis (<u>IIASA</u>) headquarter in Laxenburg (the summer retreat palace of the Habsburgs family!) to discuss the contribution that Citizen Science can make to monitor and implement the SDGs. The Citizen Science Center Zurich was represented by Rosy Mondardini.

Citizen Science can play an important role at multiple scales, supporting international agreements and local implementations of the SDGs. In particular, the group identified a range of Citizen Science initiatives that can already contribute to specific indicators and address data gaps.

The results of the workshop will be submitted as a perspective contribution to Nature Sustainability.
